2. Some have objected to the flood as unfair. How would you respond to such charges? (consider his holiness, his patience, the visible symbol of the ark, etc.)
3. When you think about God creating a covenant, why is it so important that he is unchangeable?
4. How would you tell the story of Noah in the greater context of God's redemptive plan of salvation?
5. What makes Noah a hero in this story? How does this point us to Christ?
