### 1. David's Rebellion 2 Sam 11

Saw Bathsheba bathing Pv 6:25

His great sins (REF EXODUS 20)

- 1. Coveted neighbors wife (#10)
- 2. Committed adultery (#7)
- 3. Uriah Bore false witness (#9)
  - a. Plan A- gave gifts, go sleep with your wife
  - b. Plan B- get Uriah drunk to go sleep with his wife
- 4. Committed murder (#6)
  - a. Plan C have him murdered
- 5. No other gods- set himself above God's law (#1) He knows God's laws.

#### 2. Nathan's Rebuke 2 Sam 12:1-11

The story of an innocent lamb. → "YOU ARE THE MAN!"

# 3. David's Repentance 2 Sam 12:12-15

True repentance will lead to hearing this: I have sinned against the Lord. v13; Against you, and you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight. Ps 51:4

Parents – re tell the story of David, Bathsheba, Uriah and Nathan in an age appropriate way. Pick a few topics here to talk about from the story.

- 1. Coveting is a serious sins (David with Uriah and Bathsheba).
- 2. Covering up sin makes it worse.
- 3. We need to be willing to honestly evaluate ourselves and our sins, heeding righteous rebukes when they come.
- 4. We should confess and repent of our sins, and then receive the grace of God forgiveness.
- 5. Sin can bring terrible consequences, even after forgiveness is granted, upon ourselves and others.
- 6. God does not ignore sin. Rather, He disciplines those He loves.
- 7. God values obedience and our faith in Him.
- 8. God can use anyone and any circumstance for His good purposes.

## **Discussion/Application**

- 1. What did Nathan appeal to in helping David see his sin? How may this be a helpful way to lovingly confront a brother or sister if needed?
- 2. Talk about what is meant by 'the sin beneath the sin'? Why should it be considered rebellion against God?
- 3. What would be an example of a sin that is in fact rebellion against God (knowing the right thing to do but continuing in sin)? Think about roles- marriage, relationships, parenting, serving, outreach, purity etc.
- 4. What is one of the genuine markers of repentance? (2 Sam 12:13, Ps 51:4)
- 5. How could say "the Lord has put away your sin " to David? How does this connect the gospel then and now?
- 6. Has your view of a particular sin changed or been thought about differently as a result of studying 2 SAM 12:13-14? In what way?
