Questions for Reflection:

- 1. Elijah prayed some really big prayers and got some really big answers. What do you think was the basis of his prayers? Why do you think God answered them? How can we pray like Elijah?
- 2. Elijah seemingly swings from mega faith to mega doubt when faced with opposition. Where do you see opposition in your life that might tempt you to doubt God's power? In light of God's response to Elijah, how might you respond in those times of doubt?
- 3. Under Ahab, Israel chased after Baal but also claimed to serve God. Do you see areas in your life where you are trying to serve both the true God and false gods?
- 4. How might the stories of Elijah embolden us to share our faith with others?
- 5. What makes Elijah a hero in this story? How does this point us to Christ?
