Discussion and Application-

- 1. Share what a typical Easter is for you and your family. What traditions do you observe, what routines or practices do you engage in? Why do you do them?
- 2. Why is Easter more a tradition than a true historical event for many?
- 3. Look up and read Heb 9:26. Here are 6 more passages that speak of Jesus' sacrificially giving himself for us:
 - a. Gal 1:4, 2:20. Eph 5:2, 25 1 Tim 2:6 Titus 2:14.
 - b. Isaiah repeats 6 times in v4-6 what Jesus did for us ('gave himself'). What words help us to recognize the language of the passion (suffering) of Christ?
- 4. All illustrations eventually fall apart trying to grasp of Jesus giving himself for us. But, still talk about these in the context of Is 53:1-6
 - a. A parent getting ready to spank a child, but gives the paddle instead to the child and says 'Spank me. I'm taking your place."
 - b. Your child's report card comes home with all C's and D's. Jesus gives you his perfect report card of all A+'s.
 - c. Take to time to read the Passover story from Exodus 12:1-32 and talk about a how the lamb was a substitute (took their place).
 - d. You're in court for a significant traffic violation. The judge pays your fine and you walk out.
- 5. How should having a better understanding of Jesus' substitutionary death for us affect us? How is it a mix of joy and solemnity?

Some suggestions for parents

Don't be overwhelmed at talking about Jesus's death at Easter FOR US.

Illustrations will be very helpful so here are 4 - 1 from home life, 1 from school, 1 from community and 1 scripture:

- a. A parent getting ready to spank a child, but gives the paddle instead to the child and says 'Spank me. I'm taking your place."
- b. Your child's report card comes home with all C's and D's. Jesus gives you his perfect report card of all A+'s.
- c. You're in court for a traffic violation (no turn signal rolling stop, speeding etc). The judge pays your fine and you walk out. Talk about it. (Or you can use a bank/store robber who gets caught and someone goes to jail for them...)
- d. Take to time to read the Passover story from Exodus 12:1-32 and talk about a how the lamb's sacrifice was a substitute (took their place).
